Allowing Members of IARU Monitoring Service accessing to remotely operated stations

Introduction

IARU Region 1 Monitoring System is observing our HF bands to identify Intruders. Many Member Societies are supporting this work on a national basis by having a national Monitoring System.

Background

Members of a national Amateur Monitoring Service are using their own stations for identifying illegal stations. Some of them may ask their administration to assist their work by using results of the official national Monitoring Stations. Nowadays via Internet remotely controlled stations (receivers or transceivers) are quite common in many countries.

The work of the IARU Region 1 Monitoring Service could be improved by allowing members and coordinators of the IARU Monitoring Service to listen on the HF bands via remote stations operated by clubs or individuals.

Recommendation

IARU Region 1 is encouraging IARU Members Societies to organize the access to remotely operated stations for Members and Coordinators of the IARU Monitoring Service.
